



ANNUAL IMPACT REPORT

As we close our fiscal year, we reflect on all that has transpired in the last year. 2020 was particularly devastating for families dealing with a new cancer diagnosis or undergoing cancer treatment. To no one's surprise, cancer proved it could not be "quarantined". Our patients faced unexpected consequences of the pandemic: uncertainty around the logistics of their treatment plans, possible loss of income due to industry lockdowns, and anxiety related to contracting the virus. These uncertainties more than ever highlighted the need for additional support services such as those provided by the Arizona Oncology Foundation.

As the pandemic forced the temporary closure of our Resource Centers, we adapted and continued to remotely provide patients with transportation assistance cards, housekeeping services, and virtual support groups made available over Zoom. Some of these pivots have proved so successful that we intend to implement them as standard method of delivery going forward!

After a thorough cleaning and the implementation of new COVID safety protocols, we re-opened our Craycroft Resource Center with the health and safety of our patients and volunteers being our top priority. Patients undergoing cancer treatment or facing a new diagnosis once again have a safe, welcoming place to get fitted for a head covering, bra, or prosthesis or to receive integrative therapies like massage, Reiki, or acupuncture.

We take pride in our ability to help fill the gaps that may appear along the path to survivorship. Whether that involves assisting in a patient's ability to get to treatments (through our transportation and lodging assistance programs), helping a patient once again find confidence and self-worth (through our free head covering and prosthetic programs or our professionally facilitated support groups), or aiding in a patient's recovery from the trials of treatment (through our massage, acupuncture and movement modalities), our primary goal is to help as many patients as possible have the opportunity to live longer, healthier lives.

Please find our Annual Impact Report attached; you will see your generosity directly impacted the lives of hundreds of cancer patients and their families in Southern Arizona. On behalf of the Arizona Oncology Foundation, THANK YOU for your generous support. You allowed us to continue to offer the programs and services which directly support those who need it most. At a time when life seemed to stop, you have made it possible for us to keep going.
